MEMORIAL DAY Weekend Mullica River Expedition Trip May 22 - 24

Trip-A-Go-Go? Definitely!

Location: Southern New Jersey – Pine Barrens – Wharton State Forest.

12 Paddlers: Jeff Gregg, Anjali Dhiman, Nathan Baker, Pat Daly, Tat Yuen, Paul Potochniac, David Heerwagen, Gus Miron, Lenny Grefig, Henry Schreiber, Diann Connell, Kurt B.

Type of Boats: two RK-1's, one RK-2 (paddled solo), four SK-1's, two OC-2's and one OC-1. Put-in: Atsion. Take-out: Pleasant Mills. Miles Paddled: 13

River Level: Measured at Batsto, it was about 1.1 ft. (80 cfs) on Saturday and 1.05 ft. (75 cfs) on Sunday. This was a little lower than at other times I've been on this river. But to our relief it was high enough not to be a problem. There were two blow-downs on the upper section that required a pull-over or assist. The beaver dam by the Old Mullica Campground was less challenging this year. It seems to have changed, more than just the lower water level. All in all the lower water level and some changes by mother nature, her creatures, and man seemed to make for a bit easier paddle this year.

Weather: Good, Sunny with some clouds, highs in the mid 80's, overnight lows in the upper 50's to the low 60's.

Food: Thank you Diann!

Saturday Happy Hour: Arizona iced teas, crackers, cheeses, crud-da-tat, dip, pretzels, and chips.

Saturday Dinner: Chicken stew & rice. Dessert: Cup cakes.

Sunday Breakfast: Scrambled eggs, pork sausage patties, home fries and Zabars French/Italian roast.

Memorable sights: A deer dashing up the river bank as we came around the bend. A spotted turtle, that a couple of paddlers made our mascot for a brief time. As always the Mullica River was beautiful.

Canoes for Sale

The Barn is bursting, so to make room for the new, we have to part with some of our older boats.

The Canoe & Kayak Committee is offering three classic whitewater open canoes for sale. The hulls are in good condition, but you'll likely want to upgrade the outfitting. All boats are being sold as-is and are available at The Barn for inspection.

These canoes are no longer manufactured and there's high demand for them, but we're offering them to our active members at fire sale prices. Any unsold boats will be offered to the general public at much higher prices. To qualify for these bargains, you must have paddled on at least one AMC NY-NoJ trip in the last two years. Dagger Genesis solo canoe. Only \$200

Designed by Bob Foote for big water. Longer (13 ft) and with more volume than later model canoes, the Genesis is dry and stable as it dances over big waves, predictable and smooth when surfing. Includes knee pads and foam saddle, but no thigh straps.

Dagger Dimension tandem canoe. \$275 each.

A large volume OC-2 that's dry, stable and forgiving, but still responsive. Great for tandem teams looking for a beginner boat that they won't grow out of. These legendary boats are no longer made, but we have two for sale, both outfitted with foam saddles and thigh straps. These are the Millers and the Nahani.
