


AMC's Research and Science Priorities:


Core goal: Provide credible and reliable scientific information and analysis to support AMC positions and actions across the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic

2020 Policy Priorities



Recent Success in Research and Policy

- Successfully reauthorized the Land and Water Conservation Fund permanently.
- Celebrated NH Supreme Court rejecting Northern Pass' final appeal.
- Submitted over 1,600 comments on attempts to rollback environmental regulations.
- New Jersey (re)joined the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative.
- Intervened in the New England Clean Energy Connect transmission line in Maine and testifies.
- And much more!

Net Zero Emissions by 2050

IPCC reports that global carbon emissions must decline by nearly half to 2030 and reach **net-zero by 2050** to have at least a 50% chance of limiting warming to 1.5°C and avoiding the worst effects of climate change.



LWCF Act: Enacted in 1965 to help **preserve**, develop and ensure **access** to **natural** and **recreation** resources for **future generations**.












Delaware & Connecticut River Watersheds

Pennsylvania Highlands Trail Network








